Institution Goals

Kean University seeks external funding to support research, scholarship and creative activity that will advance knowledge in the traditional disciplines, improve skills in professional areas, and integrate research and teaching to enhance student learning. Projects are expected to support Kean's mission of excellence, equity, and access. Projects that advance one or more of the following institutional goals are encouraged: *(indicate by check mark any of the following that apply to your project)*

2. Enhance the quality of academic programs
3. Develop meaningful partnerships with successful institutions and agencies

Major Categories of Funding

1. **Research:** Includes both faculty and student supported research (AREA, RUI, REU) student retention and mentoring programs where research is an essential component (McNair, Merck/AAAS, LSAMP, S-STEM); program development and research training (TUES), and research equipment grants (MRI)
2. **Professional Development & Alternate Route Programs:** Includes all programs that support professional development for in-service or pre-service teachers and education professionals; alternate route programs for certification; mentoring programs for in-service teachers. Examples include T3, TQP, Math & Science Partnership, SIOP, National Writing Project, Speech Upgrade Project.
3. **College Preparedness:** Includes all programs that target middle and secondary students to improve academic preparedness for and awareness of college. Also includes support programs for post-secondary students. Examples include GEAR UP, Upward Bound, Adelante, EEO, Title I programs
4. **Community Outreach & Support Programs:** Includes all programs that primarily support the surrounding communities rather than Kean faculty, students or prospective students. Examples include Professional Impact New Jersey (Child Care Worker training), Local Fire Fighters Training, Small Business Development Center office activities, Hispanic Foster Care training, Premiere Stages.
